LENTEN PENANCE

All are challenged to do penance during the Lenten Season in order to prepare for the feast of Easter.



CHURCH REQUIREMENTS:

All Fridays of Lent are days of *abstinence*. To abstain means to refrain from eating meat. This is required of all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older.

Good Friday is a day of *fast* as well. To fast means limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals in the course of a day. This obliges Catholics from the ages of 21 to 59.

On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My bitter Passion, for graces for these souls. I answered, "Jesus, I do not know how to make this novena or which souls to bring first into Your Most Compassionate Heart." VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR PRAYER FAIR


