
TODAY'S READINGS

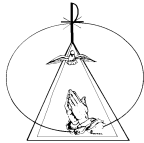

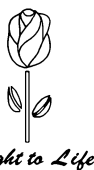

STATEMENT OF TOD DAVID BROWN, BISHOP OF ORANGE ON THE DEATH OF POPE JOHN PAUL II

With gratitude of God for nearly twenty seven years of dedicated service to the Roman Catholic Church and to so many others across the globe, I, with all the Catholics in Orange County, join in prayer for the repose of the soul of our beloved Pope John Paul II. His courage, humanity and pastoral direction have governed the Church during times of unparalleled change. And he has worked tirelessly in the pursuit of ecumenical unity and inter-religious dialogue. Clearly, our Holy Father has made an impression in life beyond the scope of religious leadership. With his death we will naturally recall his many achievements but perhaps the Holy Father himself would wish something else. As his good friend, Mother Theresa, once advised: "Go out into the world today and love the people you meet. Let your presence light new light in the hearts of others..." Such was what we witnessed in his papacy, a shepherd who took on a global significance and sought to light the human heart with hope and charity for all.

No previous successor of Saint Peter has been so well known or touched so many through his long and loving pastorate. We have lost a dedicated Christian and a wise, spiritual leader whose overarching concern was always the dignity of the human person and the precious gift of life. In death as in life, he gave us an example of what it means to trust in God and be attentive to his will in all things and at all times.

In keeping with the norms that he himself established, 117 cardinals will soon meet to select his successor. I invite all Catholics to seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit for those on whom it falls to make such an important decision, including Cardinal Mahony, the Archbishop of our sister diocese, Los Angeles.
