**Knighly News**

**Who are the Knights of Columbus and what do they do?**

The Knights of Columbus is a worldwide Catholic fraternal organization with 1,722,126 members, an all-time high.

Their life insurance for the past 31 years has earned a "A++" rating (superior) from a top insurance ratings company, A.M. Best and Standard & Poor's has, for the past 14 years given it its highest rating "AAA", (extremely strong). Its total, currently in force is \$60 billion, including a surplus of \$1.6 billion.

They are currently composed of 13,011 Councils, including 250 new Councils added in this past Columbian year, which runs from July through June. Six of those Councils were created in Poland since January 2006.

They raised more than \$10 million for relief after hurricanes Katrina and Rita, including \$3.2 million directly from members.

They contributed 64 million volunteer hours of service to church, community and youth organizations. The dollar value of this effort, in 2005 dollars, comes to more than \$1.1 billion.

The Knights established a social service to soldiers fighting Pancho Villa and his border raiders in 1916, and established recreation centers for all members of the Armed Forces in World War I, and even has members of one Council stationed today in Iraq.
